For a backcountry or snow-play experience, Carson Valley visitors can head to Hope Valley and Picketts Junction. <u>Hope Valley Outdoors</u> is a sustainable, off-the-grid yurt providing crosscountry skiing, backcountry skiing, snowshoeing, rentals, lessons, and guided tours. For easy family snow fun, visitors can sled, tube, and snow hike near <u>Picketts Junction, CA</u>. Best of all, winter 2018/2019 is off to a snowy start as December storms have dropped several feet of snow in the mountain elevations.

Relax tired legs and enjoy picture-perfect views in the natural hot springs at <u>Grover Hot Springs</u> <u>State Park</u>. When visitors seek to refuel on homemade food, daily options can be found at family operated <u>Minden Meat and Deli</u> as well as the delectable <u>Abby Jo's Café Girasole</u>.

When the legs are ready for a break or you're looking for activities that are a bit friendlier on the wallet, visitors can settle into the pace, character, and history of Carson Valley. The region's antique shops invite visitors to linger as they search through one-of-a-kind finds. Guests can embark on historical adventures with the likes of Pony Express riders and western settlers at the <u>Dangberg Home Ranch</u> <u>Historic Site</u> and the <u>Mormon Station State Historic Park</u>. The young and young-alike can witness the "neat" in nature with frequent wildlife spottings of horses, raptors, water fowl, turtles, lynx, and more.
