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Cue the Colors: You're Invited to a Fall Foliage Spectacle in Carson Valley, Nevada



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CARSON VALLEY (Sept 20, 2019) – As the days of summer wind down, nothing welcomes you to settle into the ease of fall like Carson Valley, Nevada. Carson Valley is a legendary region of four communities, including Gardnerville, Genoa, Minden, and Topaz Lake, where ranchlands mingle with pine forests and Sierra peaks kiss bluebird skies. The encore performance of the valley happens in the fall months, when a display of gold, ochre, crimson and jade reach as far as the eye can see. With ideal temperatures, an abundance of wildlife sightings and charming historic town centers, Carson Valley is an ideal region to get lost in the autumn display.

Away from resort town crowds yet conveniently close, the four communities of Carson Valley are tucked on the eastern foothills of the Sierra Nevada and are just 12 miles east of South Lake Tahoe, 45 miles south of Reno International Airport and 215 miles east of San Francisco. The region boasts a variety of accommodations, from hot spring resorts to Old West casino hotels. Historic landmarks, postcard-perfect landscapes and dining gems are all easily accessed via the region's three main roads of U.S. Highway 395, State Route 88, and U.S. Highway 50.

Leaf peepers to Carson Valley need not fret their timing. From the Valley floor, at 4,700 feet, to East Peak of the Carson Range, at 9,595 feet, the region spans an array of altitudinal zonation that supports different vegetation layers, each with foliage peaks throughout the fall.

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The fall foliage can be viewed while enjoying Carson Valley's abundance of outdoor recreation, all in a setting that's easy going and reminiscent of simpler times. Visitors can tee off at one of Carson Valley's four friendly golf courses, cast into the fishable Carson River, zip over a network of 54 miles of meticulously maintained public trails and trail run over a variety of world class routes. For a once-in-a-lifetime view, visitors can make the most of the seasonal display by taking to the skies on a motor-less glider soaring flight out of regional Minden-Tahoe Airport.

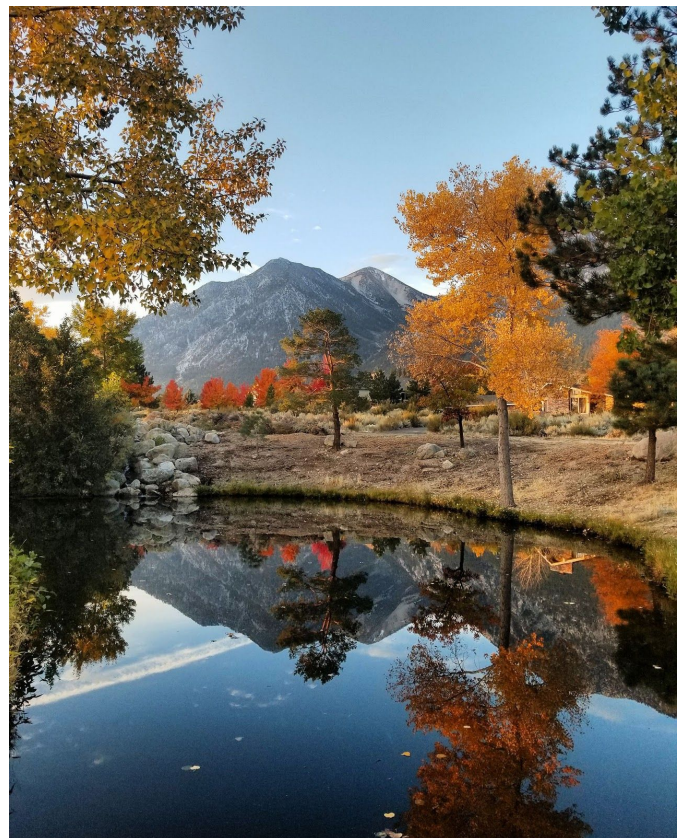
