Sunday, April 28 at 9 a.m., visitors are welcome to join the Genoa Community Church for Cowboy Church in the Town Hall, featuring Jon & Betsy Elliot, Trinity Seely, and pastor Patrick Jolly.

Other daytime activities and events include children's activities, Civil War Camp for Living History, Dutch oven cooking, Ag in the Classroom with the Douglas County Farm Bureau, River Fork Ranch tours, historic tours and much more. During the celebration, food and drinks are available for purchase throughout town and local restaurants will feature specials and additional performers.

Tickets for the Friday and Saturday evening performances are \$40 and are available via mail, with ticket sales locations to be announced via their Facebook Page soon.
