

Mark Tompkins



Tompkins teaches painting to adults and children at the Western Nevada College, Parks and Recreation and through his own workshops. Thompkins most enjoys painting wildlife, landscapes and portraits. His award-winning work emulates the beauty of Carson Valley's natural setting and inspires many regional artists. 

About Carson Valley:

Nestled at the base of the Sierra, Carson Valley begs visitors to not just drive through it, but to it. Located 45 miles south of Reno-Tahoe International Airport and 12 miles east of South Lake Tahoe, the region's natural beauty is legendary: wide-open farms, ranches, bands of wild horses and birds of prey dot the landscape. Outdoor recreation enthusiasts follow all points of the compass with more than 50+ miles of hiking, mountain biking or walking trails along with world class road biking. The valley's museums, arts, antiquing, Basque dining, historic watering holes and more add to the destination's authentic culture.
