# **Discover Nevada's History**

While a museum is often the last thing most pre-teens want to do, Carson Valley takes a different approach to history. Here, visitors are immersed in the region's history everywhere they go. In the town of Genoa, Nevada, the oldest permanent non-native settlement in Nevada, a simple stroll down the main street is a history lesson in itself. A thriving historical settlement, Genoa is a throwback to its old-fashioned western culture. See historic markers and buildings dating to the 1800s, including the Genoa Bar, Nevada's oldest thirst parlor. Tables outside make it a great family-friendly stop. Also in Genoa,

<u>Mormon Station State Park</u> offers an idyllic location for a picnic with its lush lawns and mature trees. The station was built in 1851 as a trading post. Today, it is home to a reconstructed version of the original building, a museum with pioneer era artifacts and more.

In Minden, the historic <u>Dangberg Ranch</u> is the sprawling home of the Dangberg Family, considered to be one of the first families to settle in the valley. The ranch home was built in 1857 and today serves as an immersive, walk-through museum. The home is beautifully kept and preserved in time as it was in the ranching days, giving visitors and inside peek at life on the ranch in the pioneer days including toys, clothing and artifacts from the 1800s. It also happens to be a great place for watching wildlife and birds of prey.

For history buffs that can't get enough, the <u>Douglas County Historical Society</u> offers two museums, the Courthouse Museum in Genoa and the Carson Valley Museum & Cultural Center in the heart of Gardnerville, housed in an old high school. These museums offer a look into early life in Carson Valley with exhibits like the Snowshoe Thompson, a Victorian parlor, blacksmith shop and more. The first Saturday of each month is Family Day, themed events featuring interactive entertainment for kids and families, all with a historic and educational focus.

### Wildlife Encounters

Better than visiting a zoo, Carson Valley brings nature up close for a true wild encounter. Here the wideopen landscape is home to many native animals including bobcats, cougars, wild horses and a variety of raptors and birds of prey. Take a guided wildlife tour, adventuring off road in a 4x4 to meet the Nevada's wild horses where they roam. There's no substitute for seeing a majestic band of horses roaming free across the desert landscape.

Another spectacular opportunity to experience wildlife, <u>River Fork Ranch</u> is an 800-acre preserve owned and operated by the Nature Conservancy. Located where the east and west forks of the Carson River meet near Genoa, the ranch's corridor supports a robust and diverse wildlife population including bald eagles, sandhill cranes, leopard frogs, monarch butterflies and mule deer. The trails are flat and easily accessible for hikers of all ages.

# **Put Down the Screens**

The old-west vibes of Carson Valley demand a slower pace. Sure, technology works here, but it just doesn't seem to be the priority. While families immerse themselves in nature and the wide-open space, putting down the devices seems only natural. It's a mental wellness check for the whole family as togetherness takes priority. Guests of all ages are welcome to soak in the natural hot springs at <u>David</u> <u>Walley's Resort</u>. The five mineral hot spring tubs and outdoor heated pool offer a relaxing way to connect with nature.

# **Hit the Trails**

For families who enjoy hiking and biking, Carson Valley is unmatched. With more than 60 miles of trails in the area, there's a trail or a hike for all ability levels. The Fay-Luther and Jobs Peak Ranch trail systems offer about nine miles of loop and connector trails. Along the way, interpretive signs about the area provide an educational experience. If biking, more experienced riders and families with older kids can enjoy the Clear Creek Trail, a 15-mile trail traversing through U.S. Forest Service land and the Nature Conservancy. ### **Attend an Event**

The quintessential small-town fair is epitomized in Carson Valley Days, held in June each year. This family-favorite, weekend-long festival features attractions including a carnival-like midway, games, rides, crafts and vendors, a parade, live music and more, all celebrating the local culture and community that is Carson Valley. The 2022 event is slated for June 9-12 at Lampe Parke in Gardnerville, Nevada.

All summer long, the Bently Family Summer Concert Series offers live music in Minden Park. Lay out a blanket and bring the family to enjoy music from the likes of EV & the Electric Soup, The Outlaw Mariachi and more. The free concerts offer a sense of community and togetherness, as well as a place the kids can run around and dance the night away.

For the planning ahead types, this October1 – 2, <u>Aviation Roundup</u> returns to the Minden-Tahoe Airport. Featuring world-class aviation performers including Bill Stein, The Chuters, Kirby Chambliss and the U.S. Navy Blue Angels, the skies above Carson Valley form the backdrop to these aerialists performing wild stunts, elegant formations and twists and turns for the crowds below.
