**CARSON VALLEY, Nev. (April 3, 2023)** –Western music listeners, Silver State culture lovers, real-deal buckaroos and all those who enjoy western culture come together for Genoa Western Heritage Days, set to take place April 28-30, 2023, in Nevada’s oldest town, Genoa. Set against the majestic eastern Sierra Nevada in the foothills of Lake Tahoe, Genoa Western Heritage Days returns to Carson Valley for its fourth annual event, honoring Nevada’s cowboy culture, one of the Silver State’s richest and proudest identities. With some of the most well-preserved Old West structures in Nevada, Genoa makes for the perfect backdrop for the event with century-old ranching heritage that includes some of the most stately and oldest agricultural empires in Nevada borders.



At this year’s Genoa Western Heritage Days expect award-winning Western songwriters and live performers , a trade show featuring Western artists and craftsmanship, great food and drink, and much more. Some of the best cowboy poets perform, honoring this Western counterculture that was born from storytelling at cow camps across the American Frontier.

This year’s evening concert headliners are Ryan Fritz, Kristyn Harris, Floyd Beard, and The Cowboy Way. Concert tickets are \$45 and are on sale now. During the day on Saturday, enjoy live performances, Living History Chautauqua performers, and special workshops about agriculture, Civil War Reenactments, cowboy poetry and the Inaugural Invitational Horse Parade at 2 p.m. through downtown Genoa.

A Progressive Dinner, new last year and very popular, will be held Saturday at local restaurants throughout Genoa. It offers visitors a chance to experience Genoa's culinary scene. Featuring a timed rotation of five separate groups, the dinner will begin at 4 p.m. touring Sierra Chef, The Pink House, Daniel's Restaurant, Genoa Station Bar & Grill, and the Hungry Hearts Food Truck.
