Carson Valley offers once-in-a-lifetime hot air ballooning adventures from Balloon Nevada/Lake Tahoe Balloons. Schedule a morning or evening ride to fly high over Carson River and the Carson Range, with

stunning views of the incredible Jobs Peak and Lake Tahoe beyond. Along the way, spot frolicking wildlife — wintering raptors, families of deer and herds of wild horses are common sightings.

Morning flights start at \$325 per person. For a more intimate ride, choose the morning VIP flight option that starts at \$1,900 — ideal for a splurge or a big occasion. (Ahem: Perhaps a proposal is in the cards?)

Follow the morning flight with a visit to the fabulous <u>Taildragger Café</u>, where diners can watch planes landing and taking off while enjoying a meal – the perfect way to top off a high-flying adventure. Or head to downtown Minden for dinner at <u>Khristopher's Ristorante and Bar</u>.

'Horse' Around in Gardnerville

Does an ideal adventure smell like rustic barns and fresh hay? Then Sheridan Creek Equestrian Center provides a truly unique experience. This isn't a traditional nose-to-tail trail ride; instead, all rides are completely custom and private — so trot, gallop, or kick it up and get some speed alongside a partner. All rides are \$80 per hour/per rider and are private for riders ages 4 and up with a maximum weight of 250 pounds.

Cook Up Some Adventure in Genoa

If "adventure" has more to do with exploration than the wild side of the valley, then Genoa welcomes visitors for the makings of a day date. Spend a few hours exploring Nevada's first permanent settlement — walk around the historic home of Snowshoe Thompson, shop for locally made items, explore a fascinating museum, and take a tour of the historic Mormon Station State Historic Park.

After a thirst for history is quenched, stop for a drink at Nevada's oldest thirst parlor — the <u>Genoa Bar and Saloon</u>. Built in 1853, it's one of the few buildings in Genoa left standing after a massive 1910 fire. Make it a scavenger hunt for two searching for the original "Wanted" poster from Abe Lincoln's assassination and a leopard-print bra that once belonged to Raquel Welch. And talk about romance: the bar is heated by a beautiful wood stove, and in winter locals bring in firewood to keep the fires burning.

As a final way to satiate an appetite for exploration in Genoa, visit <u>Sierra Chef.</u> Choose a culinary adventure from gourmet food packed to-go, to partaking in charcuterie on a scenic outdoor patio, private cooking lessons to an Italian specialty market for all the picnic supplies. Visit the <u>schedule</u> for events and group cooking classes.

If fine dining is more the vibe, make a reservation at <u>Daniel's Fine Dining</u>. The old Nevada farmhouse charm is complimented by the country French cuisine, complete with an exquisite wine and cocktail list.
